**Snow Threat in Topeka:** TOPEKA UPDATE: BANDS OF LT TO MOD SNOW WILL CONTINUE THRU AFTERNOON HRS. ROAD TEMPS 25-28 NOW & WILL CONTINUE TO FALL INTO LOWER 20S BY THIS EVENING. SNOW ACCUM SHOULD BE CLOSER TO 2-3". SNOW ENDS 6-9PM.
